


# Canadian Fallen Scholarship

*"We Will Remember Them"*

Throughout the history of Canada over 120,000 men and women died in the service of Canada during military conflicts. Their names are reflected in the eight Books of Remembrance displayed on Parliament Hill. These courageous individuals who made the ultimate sacrifice are buried in cemeteries across the globe including Canada, Europe, Russia, South Africa, North Africa, India, Burma, Japan, South Korea and Hong Kong. Many have no marked grave, and many were lost at sea.



It is the mission of the Canadian Fallen Scholarship to engage graduating Canadian high school students to commemorate and remember the brave souls who died in the service of the Canadian armed forces, bridging the past with the future, ensuring *"We Will Remember Them"*

Aligning with completion of the [National Memorial to the Fallen](#), for the 2025 -2026 academic school year the inaugural [Canadian Fallen Scholarship](#), will be offering a \$1000 award to ONE graduating high school student in the province of Ontario.

In the future, there will be **FOUR (4) regional** scholarships worth \$1000 based on these regional areas:

- (1) Atlantic Canada
- (2) Quebec
- (3) Ontario
- (4) Western Canada & Territories

## **Eligibility**

The [Canadian Fallen Scholarship](#) is open to:

- ☐ Graduating high school students in Ontario, Canada
- ☐ Canadian citizens, permanent residents or Protected Persons
- ☐ Have successfully completed all email elements as outlined on the Entry Form **before** April 1<sup>st</sup>

Aligning with the academic school year across Canada, emailed submissions will:

- ☐ Open November 1<sup>st</sup>
- ☐ Close April 1<sup>st</sup>
- ☐ Award winners will be notified by May 15<sup>th</sup>
